2. Seminars

- Exchange students enrolled at the Department of Economics LMU can also take part in seminars. **Due to limited capacity of seminars, every exchange student can only participate in one seminar and we can not guarantee that every exchange student will receive a spot in a seminar.**
- While LMU students have to write an essay and give a presentation on the seminar topic, **exchange students have the task to attend those seminar presentations and then write an essay (approximately 30,000 characters, 4 weeks).** Exchange students receive **6 ECTS** for a seminar at the Economics Department of LMU.
- **You are able to apply for a seminar spot via [our online tool](#) from **March 27th to April 3rd**.** You can name up to 6 preferences in the online tool - the more preferences you put down, the higher your chances are of getting a spot in a seminar. We strongly recommend that bachelor students only apply for bachelor seminars (and not for master seminars).


